Background

The specialized training for professionals on "Circular Economy practices" is organized within the European Union-funded, EU4Environment Action. Led by UNIDO, the training is divided into two parts (organized on different dates) that will focus on harnessing circular economy principles and systems-based approaches to explore ways in which entrepreneurs and professionals can redesign their business systems, products, and services to encourage the transition from a linear to a circular economy. The first part of the event will focus on legislation and company examples.

By large, today's manufacturing systems are linear, in the sense that they take raw materials from the environment and turn them into new products, which, after they have fulfilled their purpose, are then discarded into the environment.

In this system, the limited raw materials will eventually run out. As a result, within the production processes, waste also accumulates (either when incurring expenses related to disposal or through pollution). Additionally, manufacturing processes are often themselves inefficient, leading to further waste of natural resources.

In a circular economy, however, materials from old products are reintroduced in the production of new ones. As much as possible, everything is reused, re-manufactured or, as a last resort, recycled back into a raw material or used as a source of energy. Hence, Circular Economy is based on the principles of designing out waste and pollution, keeping products and materials in use, and regenerating natural systems.

Circular Economy describes a new way of creating value, and ultimately prosperity, through extending a product's lifespan and relocating waste from the end of the supply chain to the beginning - in effect, using resources more efficiently by using them more than once.

A circular economy employs reuse, sharing, repair, refurbishment, remanufacturing and recycling to create a closed-loop system, minimising the use of resource inputs and the creation of waste, pollution and carbon emissions.

To help businesses navigate the increasingly complex landscape of circularity strategies and find the right circular opportunities, is the purpose of this workshop.

Training objectives, expected outputs and outcomes

The participants will learn:

- To understand that Circular Economy is more than recycling
- To understand the existing strategic approaches to Circular Economy
- To work with the strategies of Circular Economy
- To identify appropriate Circular measures for companies
